


2024 Visitors

In 2024, the Veterans' Display was revanmed to tell the unique story of the Mayes family. From Newberry County, all three siblings answered the call of duty during World War II.

John Mayes served as a B-17 pilot. Agnes Mayes worked as a cryptographer in Washington D.C., assisting in the breaking of Axis codes. Nancy Mayes joined the Women's Air Service Pilots.

The story of the Mayes siblings is an exciting addition to the museum's exhibits and helps to tell the story of Newberry County's contributions during the Second World War.

The Newberry City Fire Department: 150 Years of Firefighting Sept. 2023-March 2024 Visitors: 1376

2024 opened with the conclusion of our exhibit celebrating the Newberry Fire Department's 150th anniversary, in which the museum partnered with the fire department on an exhibit highlighting the history of firefighting in the City of Newberry.



The Toll of War March 2024- Sept. 2024 Visitors: 1633

For the second half of the year, the museum partnered with the National Museum of Civil War Medicine to present "The Toll of War." This exhibit delved into the history of medical care, trauma, and the experience on the home front during the American Civil War. Stories featured in this exhibit included Henry McNeal Turner, Spencer Glasgow Welch's surgical kit, and the letters of George and Melissa Higgins.

We also partnerned with the Nosegay Garden Club to highlight plants from the era in the botanical garden.

We closed out the year with our extremely popular "Festival of Trees" exhibit, highlighting twelve uniquely themed tribute trees related to the history of Newberry County.

The Newberry Museum's Botanical Garden Dedicated May 21, 2024

The Newberry Museum proudly announced the opening of its new Botanical Gardens in 2024!

Developed in partnership with the Nosegay Garden Club of Newberry, this installation was designed to expand the temporary exhibit entitled "The Toll of War" by showcasing medicinal plants whose properties were utilized during the mid-1800's.

The newly established Botanical Garden was the result of the vision and partnership between a Museum benefactor, Newberry's Nosegay Garden Club, the Museum's Executive Director, Museum staff, and the Board of Directors.

Re-purposing the Museum's courtyard with new outdoor furnishings and creating garden space to supplement and expand exhibit topics, the Botanical Garden is an inviting space which will serve as an outdoor classroom and a venue for expanded programming.
